Winners of the 2011 Residential Construction Management Competition Announced

Orlando, Fla., January 14, 2011 – Fred Humphreys, president and CEO of the [Home Builders Institute](http://HomeBuildersInstitute.org), today gathered with other industry leaders to announce the winners of this year's NAHB Residential Construction Management Competition. The competition and awards ceremony were held at the 2011 [International Builders Show](http://InternationalBuildersShow.com) in Orlando.

This year 50 teams representing universities, community colleges, high schools, and career technical schools across the country participated in the competition. The annual competition gives students a real-life construction management project to solve and then present their solutions to a judging panel of residential construction industry experts.

Awards were given in three main categories: Four-Year College, Two-Year College, and Secondary School Programs. The winners are:

Four-Year College Programs:

- 1st Place: Cal Poly – San Luis Obispo (Calif.)
- 2nd Place: Middle Tennessee State University (Tenn.)
- 3rd Place: Brigham Young University – Provo (Utah)
- 4th Place: University of Florida (Fla.)
- 5th Place: Western Carolina University (N.C.)
- Rookie of the Year: Central Washington University (Wash.)

Two-Year College Programs:

- 1st Place: Pennsylvania College of Technology (Pa.)
- 2nd Place: Brigham Young University – Idaho (Idaho)
- 3rd Place: North Dakota State College of Science (N.D.)
- Rookie of the Year: Tarrant County College Southeast (Texas)

Secondary School Programs:

- 1st Place: Cumberland Perry AVTS (Pa.)
- 2nd Place: Camden County High School (Ga.)
- 3rd Place: Shelby County High School (Ky.)
- Rookie of the Year: Shelby County High School (Ky.)
